Cancel out your library fines! Kids and teens 17 and younger earn \$1 credit toward library fines with every 15 minutes spent reading in the library. Simply check in at one of the library desks to get started, then report your total time reading while at QPL to receive the credit. Any printed library material - books, magazines, or newspapers- or any homework books will count toward your total. Program applies to late fees only, charges for lost or damaged items are not eligible.

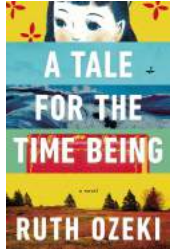

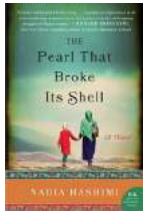
RENAISSANCE READERS

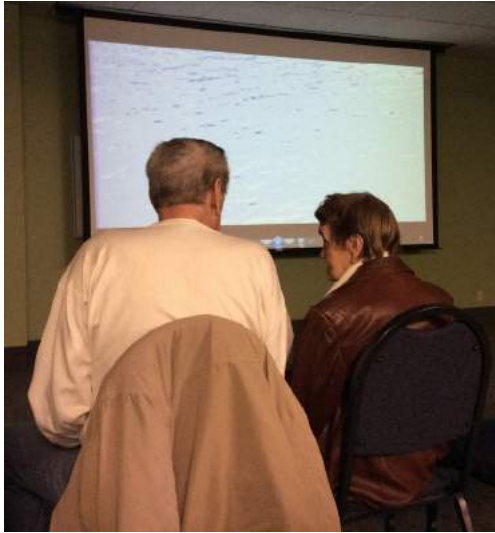
GENEALOGY

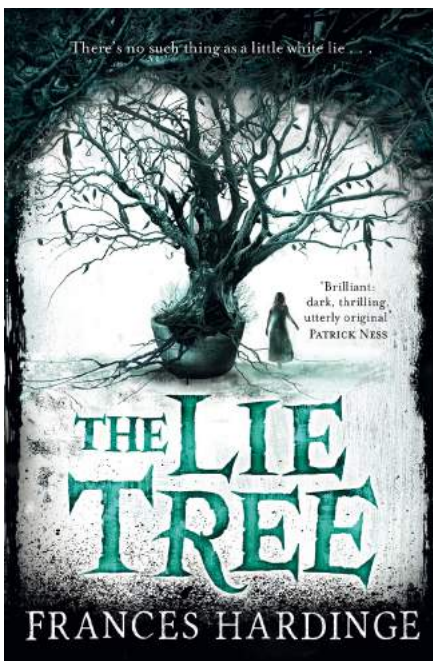

HELP QPL BUILD THE HISTORICAL NEWSPAPER ARCHIVE

If you haven't seen it, take a look at the Quincy Historical Newspaper Archive at archive.quincylibrary.org to see what you can discover about your family or business history. It is fascinating! The question most frequently asked is, "When will the archive be expanded to include more recent history?"

The newspaper archive allows searching and full image display of Quincy newspapers from 1835 through May 1926.
