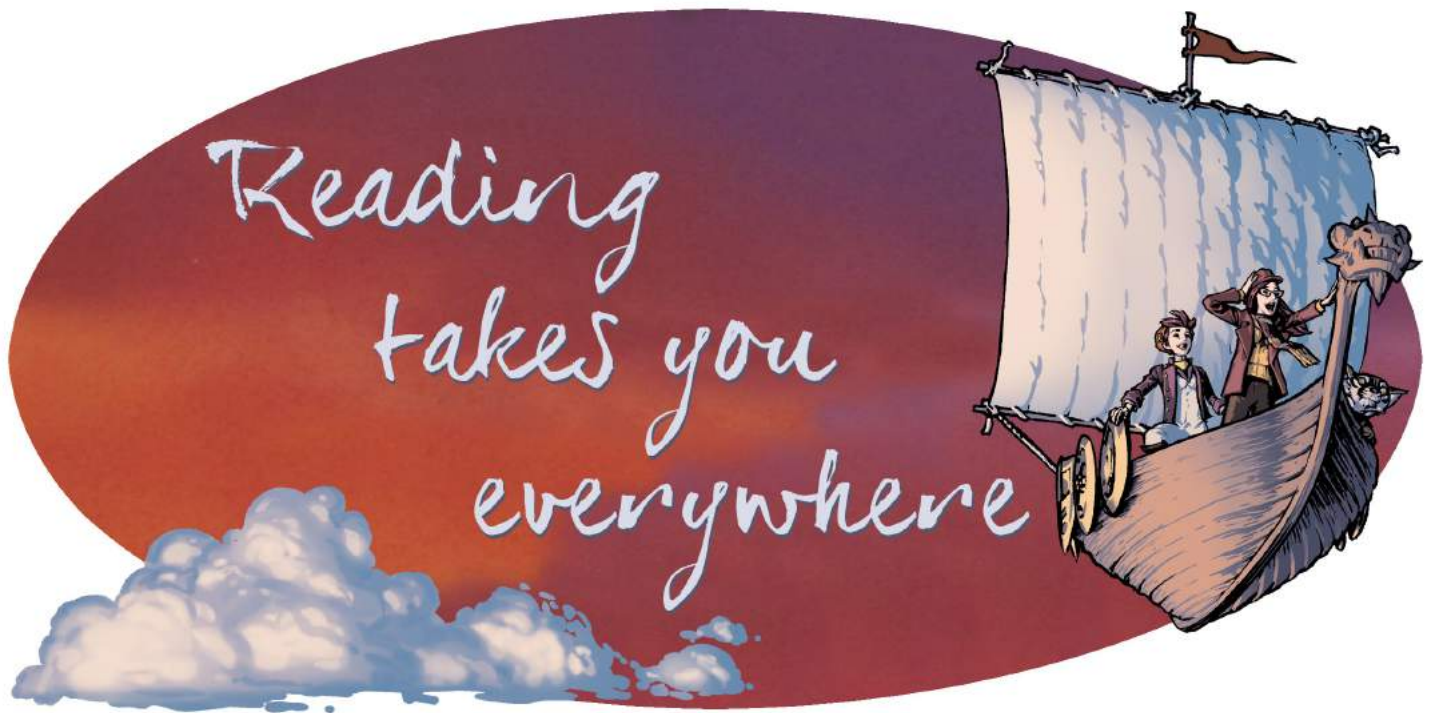

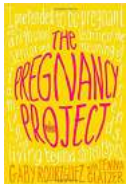
BOOKIES

EBOOKS

QPL has a collection of over 5,000 eBooks and audiobooks, available right from the library catalog, waiting for you to download to your device.

Enjoy easy browsing of eBooks and eAudiobooks at one of two Overdrive Media Stations, located in QPL's lobby and in the Infusion Center on the first floor of Blessing Hospital. The media station simplifies the process of looking for e-content. A chosen title can be sent to a favorite personal device for check out via QR code, email, or SMS.
