Kim will bring the audience into these women's day-to-day lives, including courting, marriage, and child-rearing. She will also talk about their role in their husbands' lives and how those lives affected the history of Illinois.

Kim will bring items that women would have used in their daily lives, as she discusses the role women played within the family unit. The audience will be able to pick up and view the items, learn Native language and music, and get the chance to play the drum in this interactive experience.






Kickoff the Seed Library!

Drop Off Seeds for Seed Swap!

February 12 - 17 | All Day

It's that time of the year! The Quincy Public Library is holding a seed swap to help you diversify your garden and grow healthy herbs and vegetables!

Have seeds left over from last year? Have you started your new Spring plant seeds already and have extra packs of seeds? Or did you purchase seeds and then decide not to use them? Or maybe you have a package of seeds with WAY more seeds than you needed left in it? Bring them into the library, drop them off, and come back on seed swap day to pick different ones and expand your garden variety!

Here's how it works:

- 1. Bring your seeds in to the library in their original packaging (it can have been opened, but please reseal it using tape or stapling, and place it in a small plastic bag before dropping it off).
- 2.At the "Ask Here" desk, drop off your seeds. The librarian will have you write down your name and the number of seed packets you dropped off.
- 3. Drop off any time the library is open: Mon-Thurs 9 am to 8 pm, Friday & Saturday 9 am to 5 pm!
- 4. Swaps are on a 1:1 basis; for each pack you bring in, you'll pick a new pack on Swap Day!!
- 5.Come in on February 17th any time between 10 am and 12 pm and choose your new seeds!

2ND ANNUAL MENSTRUAL HYGIENE DRIVE

March 1 - March 30

It's that time of year - QPL will hold its 2nd Annual Menstrual Hygiene Drive from Friday, March 1st until Saturday, March 30th!

Period Poverty is a human rights issue that affects all menstruating individuals regardless of race, nationality, and religion. It includes:

- Lack of menstrual hygiene supplies
- Lack of education surrounding menstruation
- Missing school, work, and other activities
- Exacerbates medical access for trans community

According to an article published in the Journal of Global Health Reports, "Two-thirds of the 16.9 million low-income women in the US could not afford menstrual products in the past year, with a half of this needing to choose between menstrual products and food."



Last year, your generosity provided almost 80 packages of pads, tampons, period underwear, menstrual cups, and hygiene wipes to the Bella Ease Care Closet, the Quincy Public Schools, Horizons, Quanada, the Quincy Well House, and the YWCA! Let's see if we can top that this year!

Simply drop off your donations in the lobby any time the library is open. Items we will be accepting include:

- Tampons
- Pads
- Unused menstrual cups
- Unused period underwear
- Hygiene wipes










































PUZZLE SWAP
